More than 30 members of the community involved in volunteer program
**The Reserve at Lake Keowee Community Foundation
helps deliver Meals on Wheels to area residents**

SUNSET, SC, March 5, 2009 – Residents at The Reserve at Lake Keowee enjoy one of the most beautiful regions of the country to live in—one that offers so much in the way of cultural and outdoor pursuits. Recognizing the importance of contributing to the greater community at large, each year the residents volunteer their time to help out with the community's needs.

Many of these volunteer projects are organized through The Reserve at Lake Keowee Community Foundation, which is charged with assisting local charitable organizations and promoting property owner volunteerism.

One of the Community Foundation's ongoing projects involves the Pickens County Meals on Wheels program, where 31 Reserve residents serve as volunteers. Meals on Wheels is a nationally known program delivering hot meals to needy elderly and disadvantaged individuals. For those served by Meals on Wheels, the service provides critical nutritional and communications support. The overall Pickens County Meals on Wheels program provides one hot meal a day Monday through Friday using a volunteer fleet of approximately 300 people.

The Reserve volunteer team began delivering meals last October on the 2nd, 4th, and 5th Mondays of each month on a route in Easley, South Carolina. The Reserve team added a second weekly Easley route in February, delivering meals on Tuesday of each week. The route begins with pickup of meals and then on to the delivery route time of approximately one hour.

“We are very fortunate to have an enthusiastic volunteer group,” said The Reserve's Meals on Wheels coordinator, Lou Ann Lewis. “Many volunteers asked to increase their support of the Pickens County Meals on Wheels efforts and the response to a second route was overwhelming. The entire Reserve community can be proud that we will deliver nearly 900 meals in 2009 to those in need in our upstate community.”
